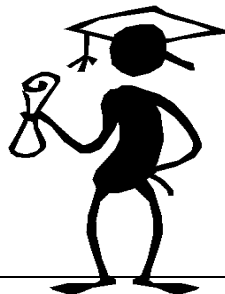

As people walk through the halls of the preschool they observe pictures of happy children, enjoy bright and colorful artwork, and hear sounds of laughter. The feedback we have received from the congregation has been very positive as our school has grown. Behind the seen a deeper level of learning is taking place that is not apparent in the displays and laughter. Each child and their family enter our school ministry with their unique ways of being an individual family different from the others. Not only are we supporting the development of each child, we also offer support and resources for the families responsible for raising the child. This includes parent education, financial resources, mental health referrals, flexible scheduling, and the occasional hug followed by a warm smile. Every day offers a new collection of challenges and rewards. We were called upon to make some difficult decisions last month in support of some of our families and are happy to report that the interventions resulted in people receiving the help they needed while building a deeper trust with them. So often negative outcomes are reported in the media therefore it is comforting and rewarding to have come through some difficult choices and to have fostered positive outcome for our preschool ministry overall. We appreciate the prayers of our congregation which created the support and positive energy we needed to grow.

The season of Lent offered tremendous support and renewal for your Preschool Director. Sharing conversation over soup and singing the Holden Evening Prayer each week offered stability and affirmation. Although I walk the hallways with a positive smile many of the very personal challenges I share in this ministry can weigh heavily on my heart and mind. ## **Note from our Bishop**

My favorite story in Scripture is the account in John's Gospel of Mary Magdalene going to the tomb. It was the first Easter, but Mary didn't know that. She expected death. So beloved, with newly opened eyes let us be bold to say, "Christ is risen. Christ is risen indeed. Hallelujah!"

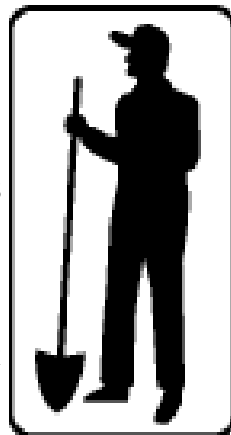

## Worship & Music Committee

The Committee met April 8. Bonnie opened with devotions that focused on our remembering Christ in our lives, in Holy Communion. We also prayed for Gary's healing and his input was missed. The way God's Grace comes to us in His forgiveness.

Goals for 2014 reviewed and prioritized. Discussions included:

1. Prayer Ribbons- Candace reviewed the cost to do this activity, approx. \$1500, and possible ways to implement this activity with less cost but the dramatic effect of the ribbons would be lost. Committee decided to table this activity for now.

2. Quarterly hymn sing, with members selecting favorite hymns, I lieu of a sermon. Congregation will be asked to identify songs to be sung beginning two weeks prior to the hymn sing. Dates selected for hymn sing are 6/29, 8/31 and 11/23 so on 6/15 and 22, 8/17 and 24, 11/9 and 16 you will have the opportunity to write the hymns you want to sing on your attendance sheet.

3. Incorporating singing of Psalm into services as suggested by a member. Discussion focused on length of 2<sup>nd</sup> service with the children's time and choir anthem. We will do a trial for 3 months beginning in the Fall and time for this will be accommodated by deleting the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading.

4. Congregational Survey of 4-5 open ended questions to obtain ideas to improve our worship experience and to respond to suggestions expressed in the reconciliation process of being transparent and responsive to members, is being drafted and will be done in June. The Congregation is always encouraged to talk directly to committee members but this will be another forum for the W/M Committee to hear from the congregation.

5. Healing Station – this will be available the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month during communion. In order to accommodate this meaningful time, we will need 4 people to offer communion while Pastor Jim prays with those who participate in the healing station. Please remember to sign up for all of the opportunities for service each Sunday.

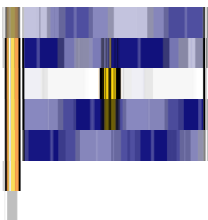
6. Review of time and talent sheets—Barbara will put information on a spreads sheet for a better summary format for committees. These will be used to update the assistant's lists.

7. Review of Recommendations from the Reconciliation Report – Jim stated that the Council is reviewing these and plans to consolidate suggestions as there are duplications. Suggested committee wait to hear from Council on their process for further review.

8. Summer service schedule—Bonnie will review the attendance data from last summer as concern expressed over decreased attendance during the summer with only one service option. Pros and cons discussed. Decision to have one or two services during the summer months will be made by the Council.

Final set of minutes will be posted in the narthex when completed. Next meetings 6/10, 8/12, 10/14 & 12/9.
