




St. Stephen's is a welcoming, healing community

Mitch Ronning: Mitch and Linda have "adopted" a family; an effervescent single mother of three children who took in her niece's three children a couple of years ago when their mother died. This came about on the delegation two years ago when Mitch and her young son Jose Luis "bonded" on first sight. Mitch states that one of the highlights for him was when he and Joe took some hot wheels over to the family and spent some quiet time "just hanging out". The clinic days were also a fulfillment of a desire he had prior to his first trip two years ago. On that trip he worked with a few of the health promoters for a few hours. On this trip, while working with one of the delegates who spoke Spanish, he was able to treat and teach exercises to dozens of people over a two-day period.

Joe Ronning: Mitch reports that a highlight for Joe was when he realized that the family considered Joe the "godparent" of Bryan (about 9 years old, Bryan is one of the niece's sons). Joe will now be sponsoring Bryan, while Kylie (Mitch reports) will be sponsoring Camilla, who is entering kindergarten this year.

Jill Adachi: "There were so many highlights of this trip. For me, every time I visit I get to know my prayer child, Raoul, a little bit better. This time we had a wonderful afternoon and lunch with Raoul and his family. In the short time that I have been visiting Ungo, it is amazing to see how the school and the students have thrived. Much of this is due to the dedication and contributions of members of the participating congregations that make up *Santa Cruz al Salvador*. Finally, (I could go on for a long time), it never ceases to amaze me that our delegations, no matter how diverse and unknown we are to each other, figure out how to live with, work with, and enjoy each other's company in a very short time. In every respect, this was an awesome trip."



## El Salvador Sister Parish News

Lisa Johnson: "The whole trip was a highlight... but watching the high school age youth perform at the peace pole ceremony was very special. To see these young people growing up, to think that so many of these kids and young adults I first met 6 years ago! Some of the kids were just "little terrors" when I first meet them, and now, just the nicest, well behaved, happy, coolest kids ever. It has been such a joy to have been even a small part of their lives, and to know that our delegations represent some of the only (USA) Americans that these young people have known. What an honor." She also stated that the trip to Anibal's ( the prayer child of Lisa's dad, Glenn Johnson) house and the visit with his family was great.. Another very special & moving moment for Lisa -and all of us who know Glenn - was when she presented Glenn's vestments to Martir Vigil, who has been leading church services in the church in M. Romero for several years while going to school, and was just ordained in August of 2009.

Colin Boyle (Lisa's son): "I am always disappointed when the trip comes to an end, for every second I spend with the people of El Salvador seems to be an eternity, and it breaks my heart when I must say good-bye. But the connections that bond between the people and the delegation always strengthen every year and I am happy to say that this trip was very successful. I was honored to play along with the other youth of the community at our annual peace pole ceremony and interacting with the youth in general from day to day has always been special."

## **Why Our Offerings Are Important: “Empowered by God — Responding by Grace”**

### **Applying Bible Principles**

One of the most striking accusations the Lord Jesus made when He was on earth was to label someone a hypocrite. Time and time again, He criticized the Pharisees and others for their hypocrisy. They said one thing but did something entirely different. They fit the description used by Zig Ziglar who said, “A hypocrite is one who is not himself on Sunday.”

That's perhaps what the Apostle Paul had in mind when he wrote to Timothy: “And whoever does not provide for relatives, and especially for family members, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.” In other words, to give credence to Christianity, to give lip service to following Christ and to trusting in Him as Savior and Lord, and then to fail to provide for our own family, is hypocrisy. To do so, in reality, is to deny our faith and to be considered as someone who has no faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and no interest in spiritual matters.

It seems like such a small thing — relatively speaking (pun intended) — that Paul is exhorting Timothy to do. Provide for your own household, your own relatives. Take care of those under your care. Minister to those closest to you as a demonstration of your Christian faith.

Yes, we are to give to His ministry here at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church. Yes, we are to be involved in ministering to others “on our own” and as part of the outreach of this church. But we are also to provide for our own families. We are also to minister to them and to care for them, for by doing so, we demonstrate the practical reality of our Christian faith. We thereby avoid the label of hypocrite since what we say is what we do.

How's the balance in your life? Are you providing for the needs of this ministry and those of your household? As a result, do others (especially your family) see Jesus in you?

## Bishop's Response to the People of Haiti

The news reports from Haiti in the last few days have been reminiscent of the reports we received just over five years ago when the tsunamis hit Malaysia - the devastation is almost too great to comprehend. Deaths in the tens of thousands, millions without food and water, many thousands wounded, international relief efforts hampered by damaged airports and dock facilities.

Then, yesterday morning, the disaster became much more than mind-numbing statistics. I received an e-mail informing me that the son of Bishop Emeritus April Ullring Larson and Judd Larson, Ben, a senior at Wartburg Seminary, had been killed in Haiti when the house he was staying in collapsed during the earthquake. Ben's wife, Renee, and cousin, Jonathan, staying in the same house, escaped unharmed. You may remember that Bp. Larson was our Bible Study leader at last year's synod assembly; she also has many friends and colleagues in our synod. Please keep the Larson family in your prayers as they make their way to Haiti, as well as all of those who are suffering great loss and devastation as a result of the earthquake.

For those interested in helping, please respond through Lutheran Disaster Relief ([www.elca.org/disaster](http://www.elca.org/disaster)), a highly regarded agency throughout the world. Now is the time that help is needed, and can literally save lives.
