

From Pastor Jim

On Sunday, August 18 (a Sunday I had planned to be on vacation for six months ago) our church welcomed, perhaps for the first time, a foreign dignitary! The Vice President of El Salvador, Salvador Sanchez Ceren, and his accompany-



ing entourage, participated with us in worship. Due to the security concerns, his visit was not publicized and largely kept a secret.

His visit was prompted by the work of Lisa Johnson and others in our community who helped the city of Watsonville declare itself a sister city to El Salvador. As part of his visit to celebrate that new relationship, and because of St. Stephen's long and fruitful relationship with so many people in El Salvador, it was decided that they would include a stop to worship with us on Sunday morning.

I can't believe I wasn't able to enjoy this visit with them and all of you! How many regular, old Sundays pass in 17 years time when nothing like this ever happens? I often shake my head in bewilderment at the strange nature of the timing of certain aspects of this job. It can be very frustrating.

However, things like this always serve to remind me that this job is not really about me and never has been. As the called spiritual leader, one of my main jobs is to lift up what Martin Luther called "the priesthood of all believers", which includes all of you. Sure, I would have loved to have been a part of such a significant and exciting celebration. It would have been very satisfying to reflect on the beginnings of our sister parish work with Light of Life in Scotts Valley so long ago and beam about how far we have come. I would have loved to see Ruth, Mike, Chris, Kent and Lisa receive the kudos they so deserve for the amazing level of dedication and organization they have brought to this program.

Instead, gathering the stories has had to suffice. And really, that is more important anyway. Because it has always been the stories that have gathered us as the church. Stories of how God has worked in and through each of our lives, and not just the pastor's.

As we move into a new era of ministry for St. Stephen's, having come through a wilderness of sorts, I am praying that we will remember these things. That we will all claim our calling to be little priests in our church and then go and act on that calling, much like the leaders of Santa Cruz al Salvador. I look forward to equipping you to GO and be the Body of Christ through our church.

Council Highlights

- Devotions were from Colossians Ch. 3 which reminded us of our calling and purpose as a church to be kind, compassionate, and seeking to forgive each other. In that Spirit we read aloud the Church Council Covenant which reminds us of many of the helpful things we have learned through our work with Pr. Cindy Beck about listening, communication and forgiveness.
- 2. Gary Meeker & Candace Anderson attended as visitors. Gary expressed his reflections on the reconciliation process with Pr. Beck.
- 3. Bill Schraft, CDC President, reported on the progress of our preschool. Council approved spending of \$1000 from reserves if needed for preschool budget shortfall. Enrollment is very close to self-sustaining.
- 4. Council approved \$700 from the Building Fund to renovate the lawn in the play area. Kathy Berens secured an estimate that includes gopher wire, new sod, re-setting bender board, fixing the irrigation system and all labor.
- 5. County Planning and Fire Dept. approval of the Senior Housing is ongoing. The Fire Dept. required a wider access to the back of the building, so we'll lose some landscaping and benches. Groundbreaking is still on schedule for October of 2014
- 6. Marta Duplantier resigned from church council. A replacement will be appointed at the September meeting. Anyone interested should contact David Balogh, President, or church office
- 7. Planning a process to engage the congregation in how we will use the funds generated from the long-term lease of our field for affordable senior housing, will be on the agenda for the Sept. council meeting. Funds will arrive at the end of the year.



Our summer program included patriotic activities, camping, sea animals, dinosaurs, and gardening. We hope you enjoyed the summer display board as it illustrated our activities. Our curriculum also included working with numbers and letters along with story dictations by the children which have been displayed.

As summer concluded so did our regular school year. We hosted our first graduation ceremony in the Chapel for our 5 Kindergarten bound students. Pastor Jim led the music with favorite Chapel songs accompanied by his guitar. Miss Kathy called each student to the front to share a narrative of the child's accomplishments, a certificate, and a new Children's Bible. Thank you very much to The Gipson family for the Bible donations. This helps bridge our Preschool with the church.

Fall starts with 4 remaining students in our older program (ages 4-5) and 2 new students in our younger program (ages 2-3). Three families are interested in enrolling in the younger program October – December. Miss Kathy will continue to lead teach the older program along with Director duties. Our program is multi-cultural and our students are introduced to Spanish, Italian, and French along with our regular curriculum due to the language talents of our staff. We hope to hire a new part-time teacher in October to facilitate our afternoon program.

Our school starts out small but mighty. I wonder if folks really realize ALL the "hats" a Pastor wears on a regular basis. I felt you could relate to what Pastor Piotter said in this article below. I was confirmed by him and married to my first husband, Tim by him. He baptized my children, Crystal (34 yrs) and Jacob (28), so he holds a special place in my heart. I am happy to see his humor in this article, because honestly......I thought of him as a tough, serious guy to me as a teenager especially:-)

More than anything, I wanted to thank you for all you have done and all you do to minister, help, support, comfort, coach, direct and mentor all of us in the community! You have very strong shoulders, so I hope you have a shoulder when you need one, too.

"Pr. Piotter says the demands placed on clergymen are greater than ever before.

A pastor is required to be a theologian, vocational counselor, diplomat, psychiatrist, writer, marriage consultant, funeral director, speaker, children's worker and teacher.

In addition, they must be conversant with the latest theories and practices in areas like economics, pediatrics, geriatrics and computer science, Piotter observed.

But the greatest service that a pastor can render to his people is contained in the words of Jesus, 'Whether it is preaching, teaching, visitations to the sick and shut-in, marital counseling, family problems, blessed is the pastor who can say, I have given them your word!'"



The worship service on August 18 was a treat. The Vice President of El Salvador, Salvador Sánchez Cerén, attended our worship service. He presented St. Stephen's with a beautiful cross,

as well as words of thanks from the communities of Guillermo Ungo for our support over the years, and for our "kindness". He asked for our prayers to continue for peace in his country.

November, when the first of the 2 delegations going to El Salvador will be leaving, will be here before we know it. November is when the graduation ceremony for the school in Guillermo Ungo takes place. Feel free to send a letter to your prayer child. The Pupusa Meal (November 3) would be a good time to bring that to church. The scholarship ceremony is not until January, so we will be collecting gift bags in December – stay tuned. That delegation is January 2-11. We are excited that there are several people from our congregation who will be going on a delegation for the first time! We will let you know in next month's newsletter who will be going on a delegation from our congregation.

The November delegation members will also be taking Over-The-Counter medications. A basket with a list of items will be placed in the narthex shortly. Because situations change, we will again be asking those of you who want to continue to be a Prayer Partner with a child or youth in the communities served by the school in Guillermo Ungo to recommit. If you are not currently a Prayer Partner and would like to be, or would like to learn more, please talk to Ruth Cruddas or Chris Madsen. There are opportunities for both short-term and long term commitments.

Everyone is encouraged to stop by the *Santa Cruz al Salvador* **table on Rally Day**, September 8. We will have commitment cards to fill out if you want to continue with your prayer child, or to inform you of what the Prayer Partner program is all about if you think you would like to become a Prayer Partner. We will also have brochures about Santa Cruz al Salvador which discusses the history as well as the mission.

Are you aware that Ruth and Mike Cruddas are housing a 19-year-old youth from El Salvador? His name is Mauricio, and he is the son of Carolina Vasquez and Damian Alegria who run the Oasis guest house where we stay when we are in San Salvador. Mauricio will be attending Cabrillo College this fall, taking general ed. classes as well as working on a Computer Science major. He wants to transfer to UC Berkeley when he is finished. His English is quite good, so let Ruth know if you would like to include him in a family outing, invite him to dinner, etc.
