

From Pastor Jim

So, I am writing this the day after we gathered in the Fireside Room to listen to Marta's faith story. We are also about to celebrate the season of Advent by praying for and inviting to church those who may not have a church home.



Listening to Marta's story of coming to faith at a later age was a powerful reminder that the Spirit of God is eager to love people into the community of faith - the church. Unfortunately there is often a lot of stuff that gets in the way of that happening. Marta shared how she fell victim to the same "Image of Christianity in the Media" that makes us look like intolerant, irrelevant, superficial and less-than-intelligent people who only believe in God because we need a crutch to get through life. Beyond that, there are the scandals of church leaders, priests and pastors involving money and otherwise. Why would anyone want to come to church?

Well, sometimes all it takes is a child-like invitation, as in Marta's case. After several "no-strings attached", simple and unpretentious "Come and see" requests from a child, God found Marta in a place where, for the first time, she was ready to receive the life-changing grace that sustains us all.

This Advent we have an opportunity to be that kind of invitation. The kind that helps to clear away the mounds of stuff that is in the way of someone coming to see and receive the grace of God for the rest of their lives. Beginning right now,

enter into a prayer that asks God to show you who and how to invite someone, to join you for church on Christmas Eve. How beautiful it would be to have Marta's story become a more common one at St. Stephen's!

Council Highlights

1. Pastor Jim has been re-engaging with some of our activities with COPA since his sabbatical. We now have a new organizer that we are working with here in Santa Cruz County. Annie Willis was recently hired to help Joaquin Sanchez and shore up our work in this area. Annie is from upstate New York and arrives at a crucial time when a number of opportunities are beginning to become realities. As a member of the Community Safety Team, Pastor Jim had been mentoring a new leader from Live Oak, Jorge Savala. Sadly, Jorge and his family found it difficult to remain in Santa Cruz county because of its unaffordability for young families starting out, and they moved to Florida to pursue higher education. Pastor Jim is now the Chair. This summer the Community Safety Team and the Live Oak Family Resource Center (a COPA member) worked with the Sheriff's office to create a new Sheriff's Activity League for Live Oak area youth and children. It was a huge success and involved over 100 underserved youth through a Futsal (indoor soccer) league held at Shoreline Middle School. Potential new community leaders emerged as coaches and volunteers, and a new more positive relationship with Sheriff's Deputies was formed. Pastor Jim is already meeting with Sheriff Phil Wowack to plan and expand the activities for the coming year, including a Jr. Giants baseball program! Plans are also starting for a Youth Center in Live Oak run by the Boys and Girls Club.

"Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace"

Remember the Oil Crisis in the 70's when there were long lines at the gas pump? The perception was that we were running out of oil. In reality, that wasn't the situation at all. We were not running out of oil. As Larry O'Nan described it, "The core problem was a matter of imbalance, greed, and selfishness. Competition had created an environment where we thought we needed to get something before someone else got it."

Just as perception created an illusion that the world was running out of oil, perception sometimes creates an illusion when it comes to giving to the work of God through the ministry at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church. The perception is that, sometimes, our financial resources are insufficient to enable us to give an offering. Some of us think that we simply cannot afford to give.

But that's not the situation at all. Even poverty is not a reason for not giving back to God. The Christians in Macedonia were very poor. As 2 Corinthians 8:2 describes them, they were in "extreme poverty." Yet, even in that situation, they were full of joy and gave as much as they were able — and more. How could they do that?

The reason they gave abundantly, eagerly and willingly out of their "extreme poverty" was that they "gave themselves

first to the Lord." That's the secret of giving that honors God. When we give ourselves to God wholeheartedly, without reservation, then we find that giving is a natural outcome. Our perception changes from that of scarcity to one of abundance.

As you consider the resources God has placed at your disposal, like the Macedonian Christians, will you — regardless of your financial situation — first give yourself to the Lord and then let your giving be a natural outcome?


