

### From Pastor Jim

In some ways it was not all that big of a deal that our Bishop Mark Holmerud joined us for worship. It was something he regularly does as part of his understanding of his call as Bishop and we weren't celebrating any kind of



anniversary or other special occasion. But for me, it was one of the Sundays that I will always remember as a pastor at St. Stephens. For me that Sunday symbolized the end of something I have struggled with ever since I became a pastor 17 years ago.

It had only been 4 years since two Bay Area churches had been kicked out of the newly formed ELCA for calling openly gay or lesbian pastors, when I became a pastor in Santa Rosa. For all my years as a pastor we argued at the Synod Assembly and watched our Bishop deal with incredibly difficult situations. And now, all that is over. And now, we are more truly a church of God's grace. And now we are more truly a relevant church of the future. And now I am more excited and proud to be a pastor in this church than I ever have been!

Our fun celebration honoring our Bishop and having so many of you in church that Sunday was a real boost to my spirit as I reflected on all those years gone by. Sometimes I felt bad for our Bishop and sad that some churches have decided to leave the ELCA. It must be, at times, a great burden to be the one who oversees the leaving of these churches. At the same time I felt relief and new sense of peace that we are part of a church that can now move ahead with our mission of sharing God's grace with ALL people. What a gift it was to have the baptism of little Enzo Salandro as part of our worship that day as well. His wide-open eyes as I walked him up and down the aisle embodied the hope I have for our church and its future.

### **Council Highlights**

 In response to our Gospel reading for the Bishop to "Pray Always" from Luke 18, we spent our devotion time in prayer. After some silence we offered up petitions of "Kyrie" (Asking for God's mercy and help) and petitions of "Gloria" (Thanking God). As leaders, it is important to actually be and do what we say and proclaim in our weekly worship. It was a powerful time as we shared our burdens and joys with each other to God.

- 2. Pastor Lapp reported that he attended the annual Professional Leaders Conference. It was held in Tahoe City for the first time. Usually it is held at Asilomar in Pacific Grove. The theme was "Dietrich Bonhoeffer and Christian Ethics for Today". The conference challenged pastors and other rostered leaders to use the lessons of one of our martyrs as we face ethical decisions in our communities and in our nation. The church cannot shrink away from the public square, but must raise its voice when it sees things going wrong.
- 3. The Finance Committee will be meeting with our Thrivent Rep. Mary Elizabeth Bellizzi, to discuss how our investments with them are doing and if we want to make any changes. These funds came to the church years ago as part of a deceased members bequest.

### Why Our Offerings Are Important

### "Empowered by God—Responding by Grace"

One of the most familiar of all Bible passages is 1 Corinthians 13, which is known by many as the "Love Chapter." Many people — Christians and non-Christians alike — have committed part or all of these thirteen wonderful verses to memory. But most people probably do not realize that one of the greatest truths concerning giving is taught in this passage.

The Apostle Paul, writing under the direct and divine inspiration of the Holy Spirit, said, "If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing." In other words, according to this verse, our giving is to be motivated by love. If it is not, then it has absolutely no value to us.

The question here is not how much we give, or how frequently we give, or the manner in which we give, but **why** we give. And it is based on the principle taught so clearly in Romans 5:8, "But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners, Christ died for us." When we were nothing but sinners, Christ died for us. When we had nothing but the refuse of sin in our lives, Christ died for us. When we were "strangers" to God's promises, Christ died for us. Long before we could ever love Him, He provided convincing evidence of His love for us by dying for us on Calvary. And that's why "We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

One of the ways in which we demonstrate our love for God is through giving. If we give out of a sense of obligation or because "the church needs the money" or because we feel we have to give, we miss the point of 1 Corinthians 13:3. We also miss the blessing that comes from giving out of a heart motivated by our love for the Lord. 
