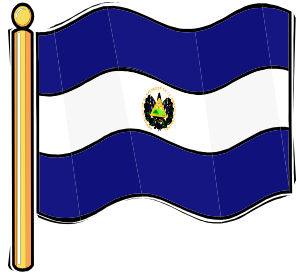
HEALTH KITS: washcloth, toothbrush, toothpaste. Place these items and any of the OTC items listed below in the blue basket in the narthex.

Over-the-counter meds:

Ibuprofen - Advil, Naprosyn - Alleve, Acetaminophen - Tylenol, Children's Tylenol - (no liquids), Multivitamins (nothing that can be mistaken for candy), Calcium supplements, Diphenhydramine - Benadryl, Loratidine - Claritin, Cetirizine - Zyrtec, Famotidine - Pepcid, Ranitidine - Zantac, Antibiotic ointments and creams, Antifungal creams - Lotrimin, clotrimazole, etc (both topical as well as vaginal preparations), Immodium, Omeprazole - Prilosec OTC, Antacid - Tablets (no liquid), and Hydrocortisone cream

From Pastor Jim



A recent Newsweek poll confirms that Americans are in a gloomy mood. 76% think the country is on the wrong track, and 70% believe Americans were much better at solving problems 25 years ago. (Christian Century- 10/04/11)

Well, despite that kind of sentiment in our land, I have been in one of the best moods I can remember as a pastor. It doesn't quite fit with the general feeling of the country, and its not because I've had an increase in my income - in fact, sending a child to college has had the opposite effect. Sure, I could be gloomy about things like worship attendance (especially now that the 49ers are playing well), and the fact that we are behind by almost \$7,000 in the budget. But lately I am not seeing success through the same lens as the rest of the country.

A lot of that has to do with our work through our community organization, COPA. Over the 14 years that we have been engaged in one way or another with our neighbors about what we can do together to make our communities better places to live, something very significant has happened to our church that is really beginning to bear lots of fruit today.

Kind of like the Parable of the Wedding Banquet where those who were invited and supposed to come decided not to, so the king goes out and invites anyone and everyone to come to the feast, it seems like we are doing the same thing. By caring about things like affordable housing in one of the most unaffordable places to live in the country, and making our land available to help meet that need, many new and exciting blessings are beginning to take shape for the future of our congregation.

From the prospect of 40 -50 families living near our church to engage in our life together, to the prospect of a new preschool ministry run by members of our church, to the gift of significant funds through being good stewards of our land, to the possibility of shaping our facility for future growth, to the chance that just MAYBE we'll be able to convince our neighbor to include his property in the exciting new developments we are undertaking - there is so much to be hopeful about for St. Stephen's long into the future!

It's a good thing we don't pay attention to national polls about how we're supposed to feel, but instead press on to live out the goals and purposes of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the midst of what could be gloomy times. Let's get excited!

Council Highlights

1. THE ROOF PROJECT IS DONE!!! And it looks like it may actually be working because we had no leaks after a fairly heavy rain in early October. Thank you to Don Smawley and Tom Eagle for taking care of all the arrangements and seeing the project through. The contractor elevated the pitch of the small flat roof part on the side that leaked, so hopefully we'll finally have the problem solved. It cost @ \$7,000 which came from the Building Fund.
2. The Preschool Task Force (Dusty Gipson, Barbara Bautz, Sheila Buswell, Tracy Fleming, Pastor Jim) met for the first time with Growing Years Director Irene Freiberg. She has hired Tracy as a teacher and is assisting Tracy with the licensing process. We will be contacting the ELCA for resources to help start a preschool and will bring a proposal to the congregation at our annual meeting to add the preschool to our ministry.
3. The Long Range Task Force will be meeting Nov. 7 & 8th with two reps. from different groups that will assist us in planning a process of renewal that will lead to a Capital Fund Campaign. We will meet with Kairos and the James Company to determine which one is a better match. They also will talk about hiring an architect for the narthex bathroom and new kitchen/fellowship hall expansion.
4. The Field Task Force will be meeting with Mid-Pen Housing to talk about the possibility of building a new preschool at no cost to the church in conjunction with the affordable housing. We'll also be meeting with the County about possibly increasing the housing units from 40-50.

time, God wants people to give systematically and to respond to the Spirit's direction in their lives by careful planning.

Speaking of consistent givers (the kind who generally plan their giving), Randy Alcorn described them as the "backbone of the church." Such people do not miss giving to God's work, even when they are unable to attend. Just because they are not physically present when the offering plate is passed does not mean that they skip a Sunday or two in supporting the life and ministry of the church.

Be ready to give as the Spirit of God leads, even on a moment's notice. Be ready to give when a special need arises. But most of all, develop a "strategic plan" to give by seeking God's direction concerning your giving and by putting aside funds in preparation for giving. Then "work your plan" by giving those funds as you gather at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church with other Christians each Lord's Day. And when you can't be present for worship, plan carefully to be sure that your giving follows your plan. Remember, the work and ministry of St. Stephen's Lutheran Church go on week after week, even when you are unable to be present.



TAKING OUR OFFERING SERIOUSLY

Applying Bible Principles

“Strategic planning” is a two-word term that can best be described as a “buzz word.” It’s in vogue. It’s trendy for businesses (and churches) to talk about and engage in strategic planning.

Frequently, when quizzed about why they should engage in strategic planning, business owners and managers will respond with a host of reasons and yet miss the basic benefit that comes from planning: Businesses which plan are more profitable than those which do not. In other words, those who aim at something are more likely to hit it than those who aim at nothing.

Similarly, when it comes to giving, Christians are to develop a “strategic plan.” We are instructed to set aside funds systematically, regularly, for support of Gods’ work through the church. In that way, when we come to worship each week, we’ll be prepared to give. We will have “planned” our giving under the divine leadership of the Holy Spirit. Then, by giving that which we have set aside, we will put our plan to work as the offering is received.

Yes, the Holy Spirit can and sometimes does lead us to give gifts in a spontaneous manner without planning. But as a rule, spontaneous, unplanned giving is the exception. Most of the time, God wants His people to give systematically and to respond to His direction in their lives by careful planning.

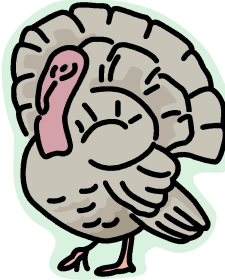

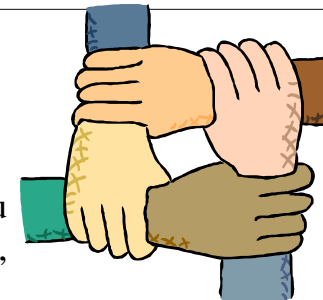
