

Recently, Truett Bobo and I have been reading and discussing a book recommended to us by Rev. Bonnie Bell, entitled "Becoming a Blessed Church" by N. Graham Standish and published by The Alban Institute. As we worked through the reconciliation process, Bonnie found it a



very helpful resource. We are using it for our council devotions and I assigned some homework to them that I would also like to pass on to you. The first exercise the author recommends is to "Assess the Church's Spiritual Openness". Here are the categories and questions:

Prayerfulness

- 1. To what extent are people in the church comfortable with prayer?
- 2. Do they generally make public and private prayer a priority in their lives?
- 3. How comfortable are the lay leaders with prayer, especially in making prayer a priority in their lives during times of confusion and crisis?
- 4. How comfortable is the pastor with prayer, especially in making prayer a priority in her or his ministry?

Discernment

- 1. To what extent do members seem to give priority to seeking God's guidance through prayer and Scripture?
- 2. To what extent do the leaders give priority to seeking God's guidance through prayer and Scripture in their lives and ministries?
- 3. To what extent do the leaders encourage the council, committees and other groups to spend time seeking what God wants, instead of simply going with majority rule?

Faith

- 1. To what extent would you say that the members of our church have a strong faith in that they are willing to trust God in all situations and circumstances, especially in times of crisis and turmoil?
- 2. To what extent do the leaders of the church act in faith during time of crisis?

Spiritual Vibrancy and Integration

- 1. To what extent does our church seem spiritually vibrant?
- 2. To what extent do you believe people sense God's purpose, presence and power working in their lives?
- 3. How strong is the spiritual dimension in the church; that is, to what extent do spiritual concerns lie at the center of all decisions and determinations of the church and the leadership?

Council Highlights

Devotions were from the book "Becoming a Blessed Church" by N. Graham Standish. The theme of the book relates to how the church and its leadership needs to remember to prioritize the seeking of God's will through frequent prayer. When we do this we become a church of God's purpose, Jesus' presence and the Spirit's power.

Council set up 3 congregational forums to gather input about how we might use the funds we will receive at the end of the year from Mid-Peninsula Housing. See pg. 6 for more details.

Council will be sifting through the Problem-Solving document produced with Pastor Cindy Beck and participants in the reconciliation process last summer. We will take one or two categories per meeting and evaluate and prioritize the recommendations made in order to follow through on them.

\$700 from the Building Fund was approved for the renovation of the play yard lawn. Gopher wire, adequate irrigation and new sod will be installed

New member Judy Russell was appointed by the council to complete a term vacated by Marta Duplantier. She will be nominated to then serve for 2 more years at the annual meeting in Jan.

Our investment portfolio was reviewed by the Finance Comm and Thrivent Rep. Mary Elizabeth Belizzi. \$6000 in anticipated income from one fund will not happen. Our deficit is now @\$27,000 for the year. August giving was up over last year. Increased giving over the latter part of the year is needed to meet our budget.

Dusty Gipson, our Children's Minister, has decided to serve on a volunteer basis and will no longer receive a stipend.

Greetings from Rev. Nancy Feniuk Nelson, SPS Bishop's Associate

It is the day that I observe turning 60. I anticipated waking and feeling fairly grumpy. You see, I had an article nearly finished that somehow disappeared from my computer that auto-saves at a rate of every three words or so. But not this time. It's simply gone. Add in the fact that I need to get on the road for three days of meetings, and you can see why I anticipated a grumpy start to the day.

But that's not what happened. Instead I feel this overwhelming and totally surprising sense of gratitude and joy. At the risk of sounding corny, I have to say that I am glad to have awakened. I am pleased to sit here with this task to do, a place to do it and people with whom to share it. Perhaps it is a function of this new decade of life, but I find that I have a very different sense of God's presence this morning. On the other hand, God has been surprising me for all these years, so how is it I am surprised again? Another reason to be grateful, I guess.

My planned article had to do with how annoyed I happen to be with the California Powerball game. It was pretty witty, which is part of why I'm mad the computer ate it. (Yes, hubris is probably my favorite sin ...) But in the midst of witty writing, I was having a hard time figuring out what exactly my annoyance was about. (Besides the fact that they stole a song from my angst-y adolescence to hawk something that makes too much of its money on the backs of poor people seduced by language that I think ought to be reserved for God). But now, this morning, I know why I am annoyed: The ad campaign suggests, on levels both obvious and hidden, that we do not have enough to be truly happy. If I were preaching, I would repeat that last part again, this time with emphasis: that WE do not have ENOUGH to be TRULY happy. That is their message. It sells their product. And we buy it. Maybe we buy their product. Definitely we buy their message. At least I do Especially when I've been caught up in all manner of other important, pressing, consuming life stuff. I buy the NOT ENOUGH message.

But not this morning. I have this surprising, humbling, and joyful sense that it IS ENOUGH and so much MORE than enough. Even though nothing has changed since yesterday when I worried about exactly the same things, today it feels like abundance. And I feel great gratitude and joy.

Writing something this close to my heart feels kind of odd. But I figure we've all had this "aha moment" every now and again in our lives. We all have those take-your-breath-away-knock-you-down moments when we suddenly see that all that we are and all that we have really is as a result of God's abundant grace. Perhaps the purpose of this article is to remind you of times you've felt this God-present-grace-filled-gratitude moment. Maybe that will help you somehow - in your life at home or at work or even at church. Maybe it will give a little hedge of protection as you go from here. What I do know is that I felt compelled to write about waking up surprised by joy And gratitude. What a nice alternative to grumpy!

Antibiotic ointments and creams

Antifungal creams - Lotrimin, chlotrimazqle, etc (both topical & vaginal preparations)
