

From Pastor Jim...

Ministry Over the Long Haul

Something has happened recently that has me appreciating God and the church's faithfulness over time. In an age where so much is expected to happen quickly and immediately, I have been reminded how that doesn't always apply to the church's ministry and work in the world. Having a patient vision for the ways of God to come to the world and continuing to hope, plan and act as if they will, is the work of the church.

On Tuesday morning Dec. 15th at a public meeting, we received County Planning Commission unanimous approval for the building of St. Stephen's Senior Housing! During the public comment portion of the meeting I was able to speak on behalf of our congregation and tell the story of how we arrived at this significant moment in the life of our 60 yr. old church. I recounted how we became closely involved with the movement to provide affordable housing during the "dot.com housing bubble" when one of our own young working families came to the council to ask if they could live in their trailer in the parking lot.

At the same time we were working hard to form a new ministry of justice which we now know as COPA so that we could address and work with "the powers that be" and move our elected officials to meet the affordable housing needs in Santa Cruz County. As our story and COPA's story came together, we began to realize that we could make a difference by being better stewards of the land we had been given 50 years ago.

In June 2008 we voted to use that land for affordable senior housing and to begin work with a non-profit housing corporation. But the seed was planted far before that time, and now, over 5 years later the vision is bearing fruit.

From here the Board of Supervisors will likely vote to approve on the recommendation from the Planning Commission, and then Mid-pen will secure its final funding in March. It is still on track to break ground in the Fall of 2014.

The Kingdom of God is breaking out all around St. Stephen's! Thanks be to God for God's faithfulness through the church over the years and the ages! Thanks be to God when we get to see the patient visions bear fruit!

Council Highlights

- Devotions and prayer centered on remembering that we have been given the light of world at Christmas and that neither the gloom of the past nor the fear of the future can darken our hope.
- 2. James Weller from Peace United Church and the Interfaith Satellite Shelter Project visited to encourage us to host a group of homeless folks one night a week and provide a dinner and breakfast. The CDC Board will be consulted and it will be brought up at the Annual Meeting to see if there is enough support to participate.
- 3. The 2014 budget was presented and approved to be brought to the Annual Meeting. It is now available in the narthex.
- 4. A motion was approved to recommend to the congregation to invest the Mid-Pen funds (\$1.2 million) and to use only the interest to fund various needs that came out of the 3 idea sessions held this Fall. (See list on pg. 12) In 2014 the council will be focusing on a new 5yr. plan that will engage the congregation in developing a new mission plan that will reflect these recommendations and prioritize them.
- 5. Members of the Audit Comm attended to respond to questions about their report. A transition will be taking place in 2014 when members with professional experience will be volunteering to keep the books and payroll. A new Treasurer will also be elected. As this transition takes place, certain accounting and other improvements will be made.

St. Stephen's Child Development Center

December was a special month for our preschool ministry as we came together with the Sunday school children to present a united Christmas Program. The response we have received from congregation members and school families have been very positive and heartwarming. It was a privilege to facilitate this union as we welcomed our school to participate for the first time in our church history. We were very proud of the school family turn out and the presentation the children gave. A special thanks to Dusty Gipson who graciously included us and to Pastor Jim who accompanied the children with his guitar and voice in the Friendly Beast song. We appreciated Candace Anderson so much as she made sure our costumes were just right! We could not do this without you.

Our children were busy last month with their top secret project of candle making. I ordered Knorr's Bees Wax from Rancho Santa Fe and rolled a pair of white, iridescent tapers with each child to give to their parents for a gift. We also took fancy Christmas pictures in hat and scarf to give each family a print and to put in the center of a snowflake ornament. All are treasured keepsakes for families to enjoy and remember their Christmas time with us.

We begin 2014 with an enrollment of 12 full and part time students. Our goal now is to revisit licensing regulations and safety procedures in order to be appropriately supplied and prepared. I have the opportunity to work with Marilyn Moore a Director Mentor from the California Early Childhood Mentor Program which is funded by the state through community college's like Cabrillo. Her decades of experience are a great resource for our school so we are contracted to have state funded meetings in order to improve our services. It is my one year anniversary as Director and it has been a fast paced building project. It is important to slow down and evaluate the quality of our program in safety, regulation, and curriculum so we can continue to offer a service that we can be proud of.

January will bring teachings of winter with stories acted out in the classroom authored by Jan Brett. Evaluations will also be in the works for parent teacher conferences at the end of the month. Our teachers have completed another semester in college bringing more experience and education to our program. We than you so much for your support last year and wish you a very happy New Year.



The Santa Cruz al Salvador Board wishes to extend a great big thank you to all of you for your continued support and your willingness to help build relationships with your prayer child. The Pupusa meal was a great success, not only in funds raised but in the fellowship. There was a lot of energy in that room!

We also thank you for the support of the Partners with Pastors in El Salvador campaign, which supports an Endowment fund to pay salaries. The endowment is administered through the ELCA Foundation. We will take another offering during coffee hour on December 29, and will let you know the total amount received in January. Pastor Martir Vigil is a pastor with 3 or 4 different congregations in the Guillermo Ungo area. Having a presence from the Lutheran church is important, but that is difficult if the pastor does not receive a salary. Your support is greatly appreciated.

January Delegation: The excitement is building. They leave early on January 2, and will be present at the scholarship ceremony. This is when we help distribute the school supplies, and will give the children your gift bag, letter & picture that you promised to send when you signed your commitment card. (Remember that promise?) Please get your gift bag to Ruth in a 1 gal storage bag. (no larger than that - please) by Dec. 29 - the Sunday after Christmas. The agenda also includes a craft project and, of course, meals with scholarship recipients. The delegation will also be visiting historical sites in and around

San Salvador. The Peace Accords were signed in 1992, but the pain of the war lingers on. People are still looking for "disappeared" children, and an organization named Comadres is still working with the United Nations on Human Rights. Another very exciting part of the agenda is a visit to the new Sister Community of Watsonville-San Pedro Masahuat. Stay tuned for pictures!

I, Chris Madsen, would like to end this article on a personal note. Kent & I were part of the very first delegation in 1994, and I participated in each delegation through January 2012. It is with great sadness that I will not be able to go on any more delegations for medical reasons. That does not mean I will not participate in other ways. However, I want to let you know how much your support means to me, and to the people of the communities of Guillermo Ungo. I have watched the children grow, along with the school and infrastructure. I have built relationships, not only with the people of Ungo, but with the people who have gone on delegations. The ELCA "model" for our delegations has been accompaniment. Accompaniment has been part of my faith journey, meaning that I have supported and been supported by the people I have met. I hope and pray that 'Building Relationships for Better Lives' has in some way accompanied you on your faith journey.
