In this very different time for our shared ministry, with each day bringing new challenges and opportunities for our work and witness, we are being called upon to adapt the way we have been church together. Online worship, meetings by Zoom, pastoral care offered over the phone, stewardship, and baptisms, weddings and funerals that have had to be postponed are all a part of "figuring out" ministry these days. It has been compared to "building an airplane while we are flying it."

We hear stories from many places around our synod of how you are offering bold proclamations of the Gospel that are reaching people who have not been connected with the church for a while, if ever. Thank you. There will be questions of how we will gather as the church "on the other side" of this pandemic, in such a time when restrictions have been lifted. Our prayer is that the leadership of our congregations and ministries will work together to discern with the help of the Spirit the lessons that have been learned during this time, trusting there is no place we are being called where Christ is not already present.
