I invite us all to gather for this worship service the day before All Saints Sunday. We will thank God and remember the lives and faithful witnesses of our church family members that we were unable to gather for, due to the pandemic restrictions.

We will honor those listed above and any others that you would like to include. Please contact Pastor Jim if you would like someone's name added.

It has been a difficult road as a community where we have not been able to gather as we are used to doing. Our gathering and remembering is a very important and necessary aspect of being God's Family at our church. Not being able to do so leaves a kind of emptiness that diminishes our fellowship and purpose as a place for God's children to live out our lives serving God together, and lifting up God's ways in the world.

These are things that are deep within the human spirit—well before the Christian Church ever existed—where we acknowledge our relationships with those who have gone before us and give thanks to God for what they have meant to us.

Health Safety Protocols for Worship

In order to help everyone feel comfortable and safe upon returning to worshipping together in body and spirit, our Church Council has been planning some ways that will help us be the most welcoming and caring for the most vulnerable who may be worshipping with us. **Please contact Pastor Jim or a Council member if you have more ideas.** Here is how we will try to be safer in a lingering pandemic.

- 1. Masks will be worn at all times. This way we are able to sing and pray out loud. Pastor Jim will maintain a 25ft. distance as he will be unmasked.
- 2. Air circulation will be constant. Fans will be placed at open doorways, all doors will remain open and the HVAC system (heat) will be running with the proper filters.
- 3. Holy Communion will continue to be shared using the pre-sealed cups and wafer. These and the bulletins will be available as people enter. Everyone will be asked to use the hand sanitizers as they are greeted.
- 4. All will be asked to maintain a 6ft distance from other family groups/individuals. (Taped off sections will guide this)
- 5. Offering plates will be at various locations and we will stagger our approach to them.
- 6. Exchanging of The Peace will be done without moving away from our seats, and only with gestures no physical contact.
- 7. We are seeking volunteers to host Coffee Fellowship outdoors only. Inclement weather will cancel this. Sign up after church or contact Leslie. Goodies need to be on individual plates and the host will serve the coffee masked and gloved. You are encouraged to bring your own mug.

A Faith Response to Present Realities

When one encounters different ideas, worldviews, and ways of living, a natural question arises. Is this way of being, seeing, and relating true, dependable, and most of all life affirming? Is God's Spirit felt and available as a living reality? Is the idea be-

lievable? Where are the redeeming qualities which lovingly answer doubts one may have? What is my personal response? A response needs to be grounded in these **Gospel imperatives: immeasurable love, great mercy, lavishing grace, undeniable peace, unconditional forgiveness, and restoration into God's image and likeness.** These attributes need to be present, felt, and recognized. Granted, this is a very high bar in assessing veracity and truth in another's statement or argument, but the idea is that these attributes need to at least loosely able to have relevance and meaning in application.

<u>Immeasurable love</u> is openly expansive, transformational, and inclusive. When one senses this quality, a warmth of feeling and heart opening takes place. At the very least, a sense of benevolence, care, and desire for betterment is evident. No diminishment, discrimination or demotion can be found or even noticed. Equality and respect are hallmarks of appreciation. In other words, love is distinctly felt and grows in energy.

Great mercy is a quality that needs much more expression than one sees today. Forbearance, acceptance, and a willingness to start over in a spirit of forgiveness can be an initial definition. Jesus, the Christ has said, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." When great mercy is extended, gratitude from the recipient is a common result. Like forgiveness, mercy is an olive branch of peace that is best extended not once, but many times. One has to let go of repeated infractions. More internal fortitude is needed to have great mercy in that letting go of one's own righteousness and control is needed. Thus, this attribute always invites a new third way of beginning over again.

Friends of SSCDC: Remembrance of Ron Buswell

Sheila Buswell had a dream to create our own preschool here at church. She was on the original task force and served many years on our Board as recorder. Sheila continued by helping with Aebleskiver Fundraisers, Dinner Fundraisers, and many other tasks including reading to our children and recommending books. They donated snacks and tissues throughout the year during our lean years.

Ron was a good friend to our preschool. He never turned down doing a task for us! He was helpful in bookkeeping and payroll as we grew. He also was helpful in getting technology installed and servicing the preschool office when technology was not working correctly. Ron always came when I called. As we dreamed of improving our playground, Ron built a magnificent sandbox. Ron also led volunteers in 107-degrees to reduce the height of the fence for better sight supervision of the children. He also retrieved all the pavers from the front sidewalk to our playground. Along with volunteers he installed pavers to create a sitting area between our sandbox and sinks, reducing the mud and dirt, creating a great place for snacks and play.

Our Toddler program was put on hold due to bathroom access. Ron looked at the plans, improved them, and moved full steam ahead to remodel the women's bathroom. He removed the shower and a toilet to install a child sized toilet and sink. This included retiling and installing a pocket door to the Toddler classroom. This enabled us to reopen providing childcare and education to children, along with offering potty training. This effort created the feeder program to our preschool allowing us to have students for a three-year span.

Ron was on the front line when Senior Housing was built. He made sure that the needs of the preschool were not overlooked. He always came over when there were problems to be solved. He also spearheaded the building of the Narthex bathroom to replace the space we took from the women's bathroom, creating a convenient bathroom for worshipers. That is only one task of many he made sure got accomplished for us. He also made sure funding was restored to bathroom project and many others.

Personally, Ron brought comfort and wisdom to my life as my grandfather was a master carpenter and could do anything, just like Ron. I enjoyed every moment we got to share through these projects and have a deep respect for Ron's generosity, talent, and kindness.

Ron and Sheila are at the root of our success as a preschool ministry, and we are so grateful for their generosity & love that enables us to touch so many lives. You cannot walk around without seeing them everywhere in what they shared with us! Thanks Be to God for all our faithful servants shared with us, especially as we remember our dear friend Ron Buswell.
