Church Council Highlights

(meets 2nd Tuesday at 6:30pm in the church.)

- 1. Devotions centered on trying to reframe some of the discouraging feelings that have come with the negative effects on our church as we emerge from the worst of the pandemic. Seeing fewer people in church, as we've said goodbye to so many who have either moved or passed on God's Glory, while not welcoming many new folks, can bring on some understood sadness about the future of our church. We talked about always being a people of God's hope, while remaining grounded in our reality. This means that we look for the possible new ways that God's Spirit is leading us, trusting that as long as we are here, there will always be a mission as Christ's Body gathered.
- 2. We sent off David Balogh with prayer and thanksgiving as he moves to CO. He will continue to serve on Council to fulfill his last term through January, since we are able to include him via Zoom meetings and email. After that he will be joining a congregation near to his home.
- 3. The Treasurer's Report reminded us that we are \$16,178 in the red for the year so far. This is under the \$25,000 that the Council was authorized to use from our \$1.5 million Reserve Fund for each year through 2024. However, it is hoped that regular giving will be able to make up much of that deficit for Oct.-Dec.
- Pr. Jim reported that the Confirmation Class continues to grow spiritually with the 4 dedicated youth, as they study the overall themes and messages of the Bible for our daily lives.
- **5.** Pr. Jim Co-Chaired the Sept. 20 COPA Delegates Assembly and the Oct. 24th Supervisor Candidate Accountability Session. The latter resulted in affirmative responses from all 5 cand. for all of COPA's agenda re: more affordable housing, renters protections and better access to healthcare for undocumented workers and mental health care for all.

Never have I been so grateful for a regular routine and curriculum. It feels so grounding! The children who do have some learning loss are rising each week in their abilities as we provide the tried and true routines and activities that they enjoy. We have also been giving them the time to just play with their friends and develop their social emotional skills and confidence. This group is wiggly at Circletime so we have to be more dramatic and capture their attention rather than expect them to sit still and listen. We are a little low in enrollment due to a few changes, but it is allowing for the extra attention for each of these children. While we wait until the new year to enroll a few more friends, people like you make a difference in supporting us in clever ways until we get there. In this experience I have some God stories.

Last week I was told we only have one package of baby wipes left. I buy them by the case which is expensive. Well, a few days later there was a whole case of the kind we use in our donation basket! It wasn't even on the list! I am so appreciative!

That same Sunday a member handed me a donation envelope and asked me to do the shopping with the donation. I went to buy a few items but when I opened the envelop, I was astonished at the generosity of this donation as it paid for this trip and a few more as we fill in groceries between what has already been donated! Again, so appreciative! Folks are helping us stock up on essentials and we are all so thankful, this November and always!

My mother always says, "God wants your little school to succeed." Teacher Brenda always tells me things will work out, they always do. They

Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany: Begin the Process of Emptying Yourself

How is your daily time with God going? Reflection upon scripture and sitting quietly can yield marvelous treasures in a reciprocal relationship with God. Here is a prayer that touches me deeply (by Thomas Keating):

> Welcome! Welcome! Welcome! I welcome everything that comes to me today Because I know it is for my healing. I welcome all thoughts, emotions, situations, conditions, and persons. I let go of my desire for power and control. I let go of my desire for for survival and safety. I let go of my desire for affection, esteem, approval, or pleasure. I let go of my desire to change any situation, condition, person, or myself. I open myself to the love and presence of God and God's action within. Amen

You may be thinking, "Wow, who can do this?" Yes , this prayer asks a lot from us. But, this is a lifelong process of letting go, and letting Christ fill your heart, mind, and soul. Each one of the petitions from lines 3-6 are behaviors that are connected to the human ego or small self. Jesus asks us to deny ourselves and carry our cross. Along with scripture and meditation, the practice of this prayer provides the inner journey of transformation in Christ. What better time than the next two and one half months to begin this process. Instead of endless activities, copious amounts of food, and insatiable demands, perhaps simplification can provide some joy and peace. Please do this in your own way and pace, if you choose to do this at all. These are just some thoughts to ponder before Advent.

With this enrollment and the waiting list for next school year, our school is going to remain on a good foundation where children can thrive. In November, we have parent teacher conferences with our preschool class. They receive a written report that includes pictures of some activities and a report on the developmental areas; Fall Interview about what the child likes and enjoys at school and at home, Language and Literacy, Cognitive, Fine Motor, and Social Emotional learning. We set goals from this baseline with the parents. Then, in late spring, we compare the development. This shows the parents we really saw their child and it keeps us accountable to each child. I love the screening activities with each child. They blossom right before me and love the individual attention they are given when we do these activities. For example, this time of year we are playing one-on-one Spider Math, and Leaf math. Fun ways to learn numbers count and add.

The St. Stephen's children, Sunday school and Preschool will be making cards to share with our senior neighbors this year. Leslie is always so thoughtful to spearhead these connections between us.

So many people contribute to our Preschool. Thank you to John who keeps us cleaned up, Janet who tends to the beautiful flowers. Thanks to our board members Pastor Jim, Bill, Margaret, Mary, Sandra, and Kathy Allen. We appreciate our partnership and support from Leslie. A special thanks to our talented teachers Brenda, Sam, and Rosio. Thanks to our congregation!


