*Confession and Forgiveness

This confession provides extended silence for listening, pondering, and self-reflection as the season of Lent calls for.

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at our baptism on our forehead..

P: In the name of the Father, and of the † Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: God of heaven and earth,

You come in close and make us yours. Equip us by your Spirit to confess our sin, Embrace your forgiveness, And seek the way you set before us in your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

P: With honesty of heart, let us confess our sin as individuals and as part of the human family.

(Silence is kept as we call these things to mind and heart)




*Hymn of the Day "As The Winter Days Grow Longer" ACS 924






