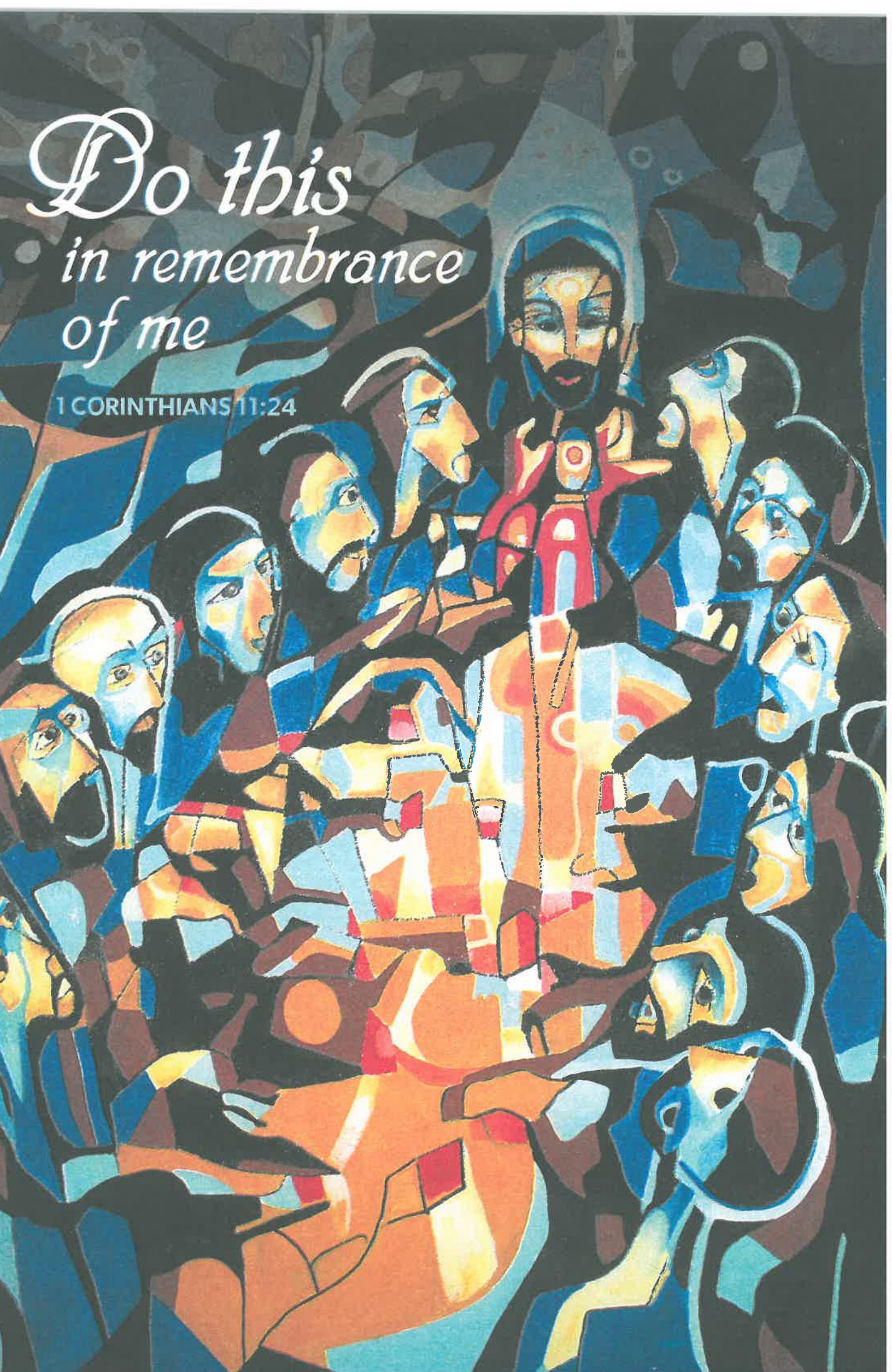

Stripping of the Altar
