It has been a wonderful Holiday/Advent/Christmas season this year! It finally feels like we have adjusted to the consequences of the pandemic and we are moving past its effects and into the new way that we will be church in the next 5 years or so.

As we noted in our series of Holy Conversations in November, it is a mixed feeling of sadness over how we have declined in number and bid farewell to so many both through moving our of the area and through moving on to our heavenly home...and the feeling of anticipation of what God is calling us to be.

I am looking forward to helping lead us into fulfilling out mission both in ways that we are familiar with and in ways that we are just beginning to wonder about. I think it is necessary to maintain a balance of both things, especially as I have heard from so many who have walked in the path of church decline before us. I also think that our new Bishop Jeff Johnson will be the right leader in our Synod for us and so many others like us in our region. Creativity and honesty will be the hopeful ways we will move forward.

To that end, our Church Council will be forming a new Long Range (next 5yrs) Planning Task Force as we begin to dream with God's Holy Spirit anew, what our ministry may look like. Some of you have been approached to participate in this exciting endeavor as a part of the Task Force as a result of your engagement in the Holy Conversations. Some of you may feel like God is calling you to offer your gifts on it as well. So please contact me or our President Shelly Barker if interested.

It is exciting to me because the last time we formed such a Task Force, it resulted in 2 significant new mission-focused actions—St. Stephen's Senior Housing and our Child Development Center. So we have good experiences to draw from and look forward to bringing to life.!

I was sitting in Chapel today and one of our boys came over to sit next to me. He slowly scooted closer until my arm was around him. While he enjoyed Chapel, he looked up at me and shared some of the ideas in his head about Christmas and the different thoughts he was having. The closeness and warmth I felt is the most special it can get. He trusts me and knows that I care about him enough to engage in our connection. Later, at rest time I sat with a few children as they settled in. The girl I was sitting next to reached out and gently held my hand as she drifted off. Her hand was petite and so trusting. I have been able to experience so many special moments with our children over the years, and the "rock star" shout out down the hall or in the classroom, "MISS KATHY!" I look forward to next year and making more connections that forge love and trust. Sometimes educators get tired, but I cannot imagine doing anything else that would warm my heart like this does. Church Council Highlights

(meets 2nd Tuesday at 6:30pm in the church or/and Zoom.)

- 1. Shelly Barker, Steven Hendrickson, Alyssa Burkhardt, Kent Madsen, Beth Stiles, Iva Tracey and Pastor Jim were present. Jay Johnston was visiting family out of town.
- 2. Pastor Jim reported on attending the Installation Worship Service at Christ Lutheran, Aptos for newly ordained pastor Rev. Jonas Eliason. He noted an article in the Aptos Times that welcomed Pastor Jonas and family.
- 3. Our new Sierra Pacific Synod Bishop Jeff Johnson (Cal Lutheran Univ. classmate of Pastor Jim's) was installed on Sat. Dec. 9th at St. Matthew's, Walnut Creek. Pastor Jim was unable to attend, but recommended the YouTube recording—especially the sermon—as it was widely received as one of the best some pastors had ever heard.
- 4. Conversation continued about the 2024 Congregational Budget. It was generally felt that we will need to draw additionally from our reserves for the coming year in order to maintain our current level of service. Because we did not withdraw from our appx. \$1.5 million in reserves for the first 2 years of our 5 year agreement (withdraw up to \$25,000 per year), that we will likely propose withdrawing more than that in this last year of the agreement in order to meet our budget. This will enable staff Cost Of Living Adjustment raises for the first time in 5 years, as well as bookkeeping services that we will need to begin for the first time in 6 years, since Kent Madsen will be leaving Council after serving his two 3-year terms.
- 5. Council will provide the proposed 2024 Budget 2 weeks in advance of our Annual Meeting. Printed copies will be in the back of the church beginning Sunday, January 14.


