The Gospel of Luke says: "It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women who told the disciples of the resurrection. But these words seemed to the disciples an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb."1 Forgive us, God, when good news lands in our lap and we refuse to believe it. Forgive us, God, when grief and fear crowd out any room in our hearts for hope. 

Pastoral Letter from Bishop Eaton

We of the E LCA join with the world in praying for the ministry of Pope Leo XIV. We rejoice with the people of the Roman Catholic Church, as they joyfully receive their new shepherd.

We witnessed the historic election of the first Augustinian and the first U.S.-born pope. We share with him context and theological roots (Martin Luther was also an Augustinian). We pray that this will provide us, as Catholics and as Lutherans, with an opportunity to strengthen our visible unity in Christ through dialogue and cooperation for the life of the world.

The new pope extended the blessing of Pope Francis, saying: "God loves us, all of us, evil will not prevail. We are all in the hands of God.
