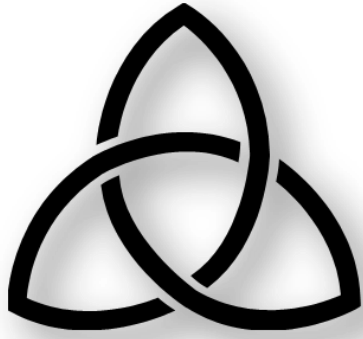
## Other Giving Options
